DIRECTIONS FOR FILLING OUT YOUR SIGN-UP SHEET:

1. Required senior courses are: English (2 credits), Economics (1 credit), Government (1 credit) and Math is strongly recommended. You must have a quantitative reasoning class on your schedule which must be math or economics.
2. Choose 14 credits if you plan to stay at PHS the entire year. Semester classes end with a “C”.
3. Choose 7 credits if you plan to graduate mid-term. **Have a parent sign the mid-year graduation box.**
4. All course descriptions are on the Portage website at [www.portage.k12.in.us](http://www.portage.k12.in.us). Select Portage High School → Guidance → Course Descriptions.
5. Notice: Stars indicate dual credit classes: For classes through IUN and PNC, fill out college applications.
6. If you plan to take a vocational class, please make sure you turn in the completed application **by February 10, 2017**. Most vocational classes will take up 6 of the 14 credits you choose. **Your GPA and a 90% attendance rate will determine if you are accepted.**
7. A teacher is required to sign your course request form when there is a designated line next to the course.
8. Fill in alternate courses with full year and semester choices. Make sure you pick classes you want! These may be used if there is a conflict.
9. You must have a 2.0 GPA to be a TA or peer tutor. A senior may only have one TA or SRT spot.
